FY-eye The right makeup tweaks can help your gaze look more gorgeous than ever. Score these shape-specific tips for pretty results in a blink. —Roopika Malhotra

Almond	Round	Hooded	Small
 <p>Your shape appears catlike (larger in middle and tapered toward temples). Eye-do's Draw a tiny, sideways V in the outer corners, then gently soften lines with fingers. Next, apply a shimmering champagne cream shadow (such as Dior Eye Show in Undressed Beige, \$31, shown here), over entire lids to make eyes appear larger. "The iridescence reflects light and draws attention to eyes," says Nancy Sprague, a makeup artist in New York City. Curl lashes, then sweep a volumizing mascara onto upper lashes to amp up eyes' natural curves.</p>	 <p>These eyes tend to look wide open and don't narrow closer to nose or temples. Eye-do's Use a dark pencil (try Smashbox Cream Eye Liner Artist Pencil in Lapis, \$36 for a set of four) to trace the outer third of your lower lash lines only and lightly smudge. Then brush an ivory powder shadow all over lids and finish with a coat of black curling mascara on upper lashes, focusing on the outer ridge. Doing this helps elongate your eyes so they will look sexier and more alluring, says Rae Morris, author of <i>Makeup: The Ultimate Guide</i> (Allen & Unwin).</p>	 <p>Your lids have a heavy crease and are so the crease is not easily visible. Eye-do's Dust a brown shadow (a good one: Glō Minerals Eye Shadow in Harvest, \$18) along upper lids, directly above crease, brushing the powder upward brows. Next, smooth on a matte shadow (one to two shades lighter than the brown) in the inner corner of eyes and blend. "The contrast between the hues helps large lids recede," Sprague says. Apply two coats of lengthening mascara to upper lashes for an extra-long fan that will further disguise heavier lids.</p>	 <p>In relation to other facial features (nose and lips), your eyes are more diminutive. Eye-do's Extend the whites of eyes with a creamy white pencil traced along the inner rim of lower lids. Then tap silver shadow in the inner corners to softly open up eyes. Next, apply a gray pencil along the outer edge of the top lash lines, making sure to blend it with fingers. (Harsh lines can have a shrinking effect on petite eyes.) Finish by swiping both upper and lower lashes with a thickening mascara (a favorite among SELF editors: Prestige My Biggest Lashes Mascara, \$7).</p>



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
